How much does karting cost?

The best value for money entry point into karting is the 4SS Class.

Our four-stroke Class. The 4SS engine, is budget friendly, simple to use, can be used across age groups with a few minor adjustments and gives great value for money for starters or recreational karters of all ages.

How old do I have to be to start karting?

Boys and girls, can start driving at the age of six years old and have their first race at seven years old. Karting is a sport enjoyed by people of all ages.

Where do I buy a kart?

We recommend that you purchase your karts, engines and equipment from a reputable karting retailer to ensure that the kart is suitable for your age, size and experience, along with complying with all Karting Australia rules.

How often can I race?

Most Clubs across the country host events once per month, however, there are also opportunities to race at neighbouring Clubs. When first starting out, we encourage you to complete some Social Karting Days at your local Club before embarking on your first race.

How fast do they go?

The speed of a kart depends on the age group. As a young Cadet driver, the top speed is approximately 80 km/h while Junior and Senior Drivers reach speeds closer to 100 km/h. These speeds depend on the size of the track.
